Needs list – Interfaith Refugee Ministry Volunteers

- Transportation to or from work, community college classes, shopping, medical appointments, and other activities for several refugee women. (You would sign up for times that work with your schedule.)
- Tutors for the two high school students living in northeast Baltimore in English classes required for graduation (not ESL), biology, general science, computer science.
- A “conversational English” partner for an Afghan woman in Elkridge who is just learning English.
- English tutoring for an Afghan man in Elkridge who wants to improve his written and spoken English.
- Lawyers to accompany individuals who have expected, or unexpected, immigration-related appearances, hearings, meetings, etc. A working group is forming for this. You do not have to be an immigration attorney.

Needs list – Items

- Used laptops in good, working condition, not old (unfortunately, many programs will not load onto older laptops).
- Walmart gift cards for families losing all or most of their SNAP benefits. (May be dropped off at the church office in an envelope clearly marked for refugee ministry, or given to Susan or Russ Fedors)
- **Direct donations** to the Interfaith Refugee Ministry may be made by check to “Christ Church” with “Refugee Ministry” in the memo, and mailed to CHRIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH, 6800 Oakland Mills Road, Columbia, MD 21045. Be sure to identify the church you are from.
